Provided that the State Government may appoint different dates in respect of any of the items referred to in Cls. (a) to (d) above.

3-A. Continuance of English language for use in Legislature. Notwithstanding the expiration of the period of fifteen years from the commencement of the Constitution of India, the English language may, as from the 26th day of January 1965, continue to be used, in addition to Oriya for the transaction of businsss in Legislature of the State of Orissa.
